Ephesians 1:18-23

What does power look like?

1. Partnership Power me with the eternal 1:18-19

¹⁸ I pray that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which he has called you, the riches of his glorious inheritance in his holy people, ¹⁹ and his incomparably great power for us who believe.

2. Resurrection Power brings me from the dead 1:19-20

¹⁹ and his incomparably great power for us... That power is the same as the mighty strength ²⁰ he exerted when he raised Christ from the dead

Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, he who raised Christ from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies because of his Spirit who lives in you. (Romans 8:11)

¹⁰ I want to know Christ – yes, to know the power of his resurrection and participation in his sufferings, becoming like him in his death, ¹¹ and so, somehow, attaining to the resurrection from the dead. (Philippians 3:10-11)
